



Collections Analysis for Serials & Journals



- Bib and holdings data ingest, enhancement, and group analysis
- Established workflows and standards

What do libraries need to do to participate in collections analysis and archiving?


- Group collections analysis
 - Submit MARC bibliographic and holdings data for your print serials
- Archiving (also known as retention)
 - Complete holdings record updates & submit data for national registries
 - Members can choose to archive a lot, a little, or nothing at all

Discovery & Access



- Discovery is essential
 - Disclosure of archived holdings in local systems, OCLC, and shared print registries
 - Opportunities for local discovery
- Support for resource sharing
 - OCLC Profiled Group
 - RapidILL pod

Data-Informed Decision-Making



- Easy to use tools and reports
- Retention & deselection
- Collection comparison at any time
- Metadata validation

What's coming up

- Summer 2025
 - Gap-filling Pilot findings to help WEST refine its strategies to complete the archives efficiently
 - Internet Archive Pilot findings to create ongoing workflows for digitization streams to complement the print archives
- Fall 2025
 - Libraries submit data for group collections analysis
- Summer 2026
 - Archiving proposals and comparison reports to libraries

- Fixed fees are tiered
- As of FY24-25 Average of 2019, 2020, and 2021 total library expenditures data
- Annual 3% increase to account for inflation
