Carole Boston Weatherford. Moses; when Harriet Tubman led her people to freedom. Hyperion Books for Children, 2006. (Illustrated by Kadir Nelson...Love his illustrations!! He has done covers for the New Yorker Magazine and has won the Caldecott Prize for Children's books illustration)
